A snap shot of the Fifty-Sixth Convention

The Fifty-Sixth Convention of the Lutheran Women of SA-NT was held on Thursday 4th May at St Paul's Lutheran Church Glenelg. The congregation members had prepared the church and the hall as a lovely welcoming atmosphere. Students from Immanuel College produced some art work to illustrate the theme: "Storms of Life" and these were displayed in the church. The theme was chosen as the focus for the day based on the words of 2 Thessalonians 3:3a 'But the Lord is faithful and he will strengthen and protect you.'

People gathered for a welcome cuppa with some having travelled by either car, train or bus and then tram to get to the venue. At 9:30 am the opening worship began with local Pastor Tim Ebbs leading the service. The hymn 'Jesus, lover of my soul' was sung. Pastor Tim told us how many years ago while on the Spirit of Tasmania he encountered a stormy trip from



Melbourne to Devonport, Tasmania. He recounted that we all experience storms in our lives but we need to remember that Jesus has told us not to be afraid as he is with us. He reminded the gathering of the time when Jesus was in a boat with his disciples and a severe storm was threatening to swamp the boat but Jesus was asleep in the stern. The disciples woke him up and Jesus calmed the waves and he asked them 'Why were so afraid? Do you still have no faith'? The song 'Jesus, please watch over us' concluded the service.

President Josie Hunt welcomed all in attendance. On behalf of the Glenelg Lutheran Church, Chairperson Sharon Edwards welcomed the gathering and encouraged all to enjoy the day of fellowship.

LCASA-NT District Bishop David Altus and Assistant Bishop for mission Pastor Stephen Schultz addressed the gathering with words of encouragement and gave thanks to the Lutheran Women for all the support that has been given too many different projects.

In memory of those dearly departed, the hymn 'Take thou my hand and lead me' was sung.



The morning guest speaker was John van Ruth, Chief Executive Officer for Lutheran Disability Services. He told the gathering of his background as the youngest of eleven children and migrated to Australia from Holland, and of his mother who was a Christian witness to many people.

The world will say disability is a disability in the community. In Christ's view disability is normal as a part of the broken sinful world in which we live. How then do we work this through with the world in addressing this broken stormy situation? The role at Lutheran Disability Services is working with clients to enable them to live in houses with support staff. What are the values? Not all clients are Lutheran or even Christians. Encouragement is given to the clients to serve and help one another. This is God's love in action. There are currently 84 clients living in homes in different locations in the metropolitan area, the Adelaide Hills and the Barossa Valley. These people are like family and learn to become independent with help from support of staff which are funded by the Government.

How do we see "Storms of Life"? The non-verbal client has a

way of sharing love to others. Life is sometimes 'messy', but God is still present. This service tries to connect clients with congregations and other Christian Communities. This has resulted in some clients having come to the Christian faith. At times, clients do not have any family support. Lutheran Disability



Services works closely with other services like NDIS. **Lutheran Disability Services** is located at the Wellington Centre, 2 Portrush Road, Payneham, SA. (Corner Portrush Road and Payneham Road). Phone: (08) 8212 7766. The Lutheran Women of SA-NT has this service as one of its projects.



During the lunch break there was plenty to see at the displays in the hall and to purchase some items from the Lobethal Christian Book Centre. The opportunity was also there to support the Community Care Program of the Glenelg congregation by making a purchase at the well-displayed and stocked Op Shop at the adjacent building.

The afternoon session began with the Immanuel College Year 9 Music students playing for the singing of the song 'Here I am to worship' and an opening devotion during which two ladies from the




Glenelg congregation shared how they walked through many 'storms' in their life and how they overcame these storms. The song 'Lead me to the cross' was sung. Pastor Tim led a prayer of thanksgiving for the total of \$8,672.00 received for the offering. From this, \$1,000.00 was given to the Glenelg Community Care Program and the remainder divided between Lutheran Disability Services and Lutheran Media. The Music students concluded with the song 'Can't Stop Singing'.

The first spot speaker was Grace Bock from the **Editorial Committee** for the **Lutheran Women Magazine**. She explained that the cost to print and send each single issue of the magazine amounts to \$3.67 per issue. At six issues per year, this amounts to \$22.02. This means that to break even, subscriptions should be at least this amount per annum but subscribers are only paying \$14.00 per annum.

<u>The next spot speaker</u> was Erin Kerber who spoke on behalf of LCA International Missions. She had recently returned from having made a visit to Indonesia. There are many mission places that are supported through the donations from Lutheran Women of Australia.

As a break in proceedings, the gathering stood and sang the song 'On eagle's wings'.



Information from Lutheran Laypeople's League was presented by the Events Coordinator & Administrator Shari Savio. The LLL is unique as it is Australia's only 'philanthropic' bank. The mission of the LLL is to provide support to the Lutheran Church of Australia through business and financial help. The LLL was founded in 1921 for the specific purpose of providing resources to the church.

<u>The final spot speaker</u>, Julie Krause, presented from Australian Lutheran World Service (ALWS): **SHELTER FROM THE STORM...**

Storms can be wondrous. Amazing displays of God's mighty power. Storms can also be frightening. Devastating. Life threatening. Life changing. And 'storms' can be a picture of what lives can look like when they feel out of control. Unsafe.

There are many difficult and disastrous situations in our world, but what we see at ALWS is that the size of the challenges are matched by the size of the kindness of people like you! I'm here to say a huge thank you for how you have already been shining your light into many dark and stormy places.

Like your huge kindness and response to the horrors facing the people in Ukraine. You have been meeting people as they fled for safety, women and children, as the men between 18-60 had to stay behind and fight . . . doing the hands-on-grunge work [as so many of you do in your everyday lives] — cooking, washing dishes, feeding, hosting families . . . Volunteers [people like you] packing supplies, speaking kind words or giving smiles . . . and just like the people in Poland who are welcoming and assisting the many mothers and children who have fled Ukraine, you see them 'as guests and not refugees'.



It is many of your brothers and sisters in Christ in the Lutheran and Christian churches there who offer Polish classes to help integrate and find new opportunities for them in Polish society. The classes are supported by the Lutheran World Federation (LWF).

Through LWF you are also offering courses in skills such as manicure techniques to enable women to find some work to support themselves and their children or elderly relatives. Art therapy classes for



children who have experienced trauma are part of the psychosocial support you provide. Bringing hope and healing . . . light in the dark.

And then of course, there were the horrors of the earthquake in Turkiye and Syria. First of all, you were there on the front line offering basic needs such as hygiene supplies, water, food, tarps for shelter, counselling. But now you are still there offering the practical help of finding apartments to rent while homes and lives are being repaired.

"In the coming weeks and months, LWF will

focus on shelter maintenance and rehabilitation, renovating schools and educational facilities and psychological and psychosocial support," said Khamees.


School is one of the most effective ways to help children recover from trauma, as they see life can be 'normal' again. Children learn. Have fun. Make friends. Play.

Again, as the storms of conflict break out in Sudan, you are there welcoming the traumatised and frightened as they cross borders into neighbouring countries. Not always on the news . . . but there nevertheless, doing the needed work and bringing love to life, not only in disaster zones, but also in the forgotten ordinary lives of families who struggle to feed their children or obtain medical help when needed. You are there - whether it is in one of the poorest countries in the world like Burundi or amongst the Dalits of Nepal or giving dignity to the many who live with disability – you are there – training, skilling, teaching, empowering, bringing sunshine into the storms. Thank you!

Isaiah 32:2 "Each one will be like a shelter from the wind and a refuge from the storm, like streams of water in the desert and the shadow of a great rock in a thirsty land."





14th March, 2023.



The theme for the day was 'Her place in HIStory – HIS place in Her stories'. The theme highlighted how women of faith used their talents in His service.

Pastor Peter Traeger opened with a devotion and talked about the women who influenced him in his life.

We studied Katharine Luther, an amazingly strong Christian woman and sang Hymn LHS 195 – "A Mighty fortress is our God".

Charlotte Elliott was a hymn writer who wrote the words for "Just as I am" and "Thy will be done". We sang the Hymn LHS 335 – "Just as I am without one plea".

We learnt about the "Etona" paddle steamer – A Church of England Mission boat on the River Murray. This boat would have steamed past the Murbko church many times. We sang Hymn LHS 442 – "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation".

We enjoyed a cuppa and fellowship in the sunshine and feasted on local fruit and produce. It was a privilege to welcome Meredith Resce

who is an author of Christian Fiction and Historical Romance.
Meredith started writing in 1991 and has published 24 books. Meredith is a great storyteller. She touched on how stories are passed down through the generations and how she



enjoyed listening to her grandmother telling stories.

Frieda Strehlow, wife of Carl, worked with him at the Hermannsburg mission with the Western Arrarnta people. She was a skilled seamstress and taught Aboriginal ladies to sew and how to care for their babies. We sang Hymn LHS 487 – "Wake, awake, for night is flying" in her memory.

Ella Footner was born in Renmark and worked with a desert tribe as a nurse at Ooldea Tank, around 200 km north west of Ceduna, Yalata and Koonibba Lutheran Mission. We were pleased to welcome her youngest daughter Christa who joined us on the day. We sang LHS 426 – "What a friend we have in Jesus".

Queen Elizabeth II showed her faith in her Christmas messages. For her funeral, she picked the hymns, readings and prayers showing her faith and trust in Jesus. Our closing song was Hymn LHS 577 – "God save our gracious King".

Lutheran Care

The Op Shops are doing well. More volunteers are needed so that the shops can remain



open all day. You are welcome to volunteer your time, even for just a half day.

At this time of the year, good and clean donations of winter clothes is needed. Plain colour beanies and scarves are also welcomed donations. Rugs and quilts are always needed especially during the winter months.

Non-perishable food donations are to be delivered directly to the front office and clothing and other items to the front door of the shop.

Keep sewing the cloth bags for Lutheran Care to use at the Op Shops and for Emergency Relief hand-outs. Suitable material can be obtained from the sorting area behind the Op Shop at Blair Athol.

The ideal size for Op Shop bags is 53 cm (21 in) long x 46 cm (18 in) wide with 46 cm (18 in) length handles sewn on similar to a shopping bag. Bags used for Emergency Relief hand-outs need to be made in a similar size, but from stronger material as food parcels are heavier. Sew the corners to make a box shape at the bottom of the bag.

Small cloth bags are also good for putting in any jewellery purchases.

Keep sewing and may your work be a blessing to many.

Honey Biscuits

Thank you to all the people who are prepared to make Honey Biscuits. Included with the bags is a series of stickers listing the ingredients which needs to be stuck onto the bags. The Honey Biscuits can be iced, or you can make them special with long



sprinkles, choc bits or cherries. Please do NOT use hard cachous, 100's and 1,000's, or toppings that can get stuck between teeth, or under mouth plates. Please: NO NUTS.

Pack 125 grams [4 oz.] of biscuits into each bag. Close the bag with curling ribbon, and you may attach a Christmas tract/small card, telling the recipient which Fellowship has prepared the packet.




